Why bother to create an electronic record keeping system? So you'll instantly know:

- What you have
- Where it is
- What it cost
- Where it came from
- What it's worth

Organizing Your Collection

What should you keep a record of?

- Identification Number
- Creator / Artist
- Subject / Title
- Date Made / Measurements
- Photograph(s)
- Description (e.g., colors + dyes, technique, use, geography)
- Acquisition Information (e.g., evidence of legal ownership, provenance)
- Condition (e.g., fraying, mildew, creasing)
- Estimated Value (e.g., appraisal, auction records, insurance)
- Bibliography / Exhibition History
- Current Location

Which Collections Management Software is Right For You?

Start out by asking yourself:

- 1) Do you work on a PC or a Mac or both?
- 2) Will you use it only on a desktop or laptop -- or also on mobile devices?
- 3) Will you store the database on your computer's hard drive or in the Cloud?
- 4) Do others need to have access to and be able to edit it?

FileMaker Pro 16

- Familiar software that can be used to create and manage a database.
- Does not have art collection templates. You have to decide what data fields you need, how they should be organized, and then build it yourself.
- Can only upload and display thumb nail photos.
- \$329 charge for software for individuals and teams of less than 5. Runs on a PC, a Mac, and mobile devices. Filemaker Cloud is also available and billed on an hourly or monthly basis.

Microsoft Access 2016

- This is a basic database software, designed for use on a desktop.
- Like FileMaker, there are no art collection templates you can use. You have to design and build it yourself.
- \$110 charge for software. Does not run on a Mac.

Collectify Collectors' Edition

- Designed for use by an individual art collector (holds up to 1200 records).
- Choose from pre-defined collection types and templates or customize your own fields. Can also customize screen display and reports.
- Can import photos of various sizes, plus store sound clips and videos.
- \$189.95 charge for software. Fully compatible with Windows. To run it on a Mac, need to upload Windows emulation software or subscribe to Collectify Cloud.

PastPerfect 5.0

- Professional museum software used by smaller cultural institutions. Powerful and designed to handle collections of tens of thousands of records.
- Relatively simply to use and has customizable data fields.
- The vendor is developing a web-based version, but not yet available.
- \$870 for the software, plus \$385 for the Multimedia upgrade.
