
My daughter,

Right away we noticed that something was going on.

It was the annual Scarecrow Contest. All along a central set of blocks on Main St., scarecrows were standing in a kind of welcome.

We remembered this event from many years earlier. In the 70s, we lived in the Middletown Valley and Shelly graduated from the Middletown High School in 1980. She feels a bit like she's come home.

I've always been impressed with the Scarecrow Contest as an event that signals Middletown's strong sense of itself as a community.

It seems to me to require a full documentation and that is what this piece is about.

This contest is open to all Middletown Valley groups, businesses, families, and individuals.

## Important dates & Information:

- 1. This is a family event. Please no political or excessively violent scarecrows, or weapons of any sort!
- 2. The Middletown Arts and Activities Council reserves the right to reject any entry that is inappropriate.
- 3. Completed scarecrows are due back to the Municipal Center on or before October 13, 2023, by 4:00pm.
- 4. Scarecrows will be displayed along Main Street from October 14th through October 31st.
- 5. The scarecrow entries will be judged by the community on October 14th. Ballots will be provided beginning at 2:00pm at the municipal center. Voting ends at 5:00pm with winners being announced after the ballots have been counted.
- 6. Scarecrows should be removed by their creator by November 1st. Any scarecrow that is not taken down by said date will be removed by the MAAC and discarded.
- 7. Should you realize that you will <u>not</u> be participating in the contest, PLEASE return the unused kit to the Municipal Center.

## **Rules and Regulations:**

- Your completed scarecrow should be no more than 4' wide and 6.5' tall.
- Scarecrows must be structurally sound since they will be displayed outdoors.
- Store bought masks are discouraged.
- Completed scarecrows are due back to the Municipal Center by October 13th.
- Scarecrows will be displayed along Main Street from October 14th through October 31st.
- The Middletown Arts and Activities Council will hang your scarecrow on October 14th.
- The scarecrow entries will be judged by the community on October 14th. Ballots will be provided beginning at 2:00 at the municipal center. Voting ends at 5:00 with winners being announced after the ballots have been counted.
- Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place and Burgess' Choice in 2 Categories: Individual/Family and Business/Organization. Winners do not have to be present.
- Winners will be listed on the Town's website: www.middletown.md.us
- Scarecrows should be removed by the creator by November 1st. Any scarecrow that is not taken down
  by said date will be removed by the Middletown Arts and Activities Council and discarded;
- The Middletown Arts and Activities Council does not assume any liability for damage or loss of any scarecrow entry.

The Middletown Arts and Activities Council reserves the right to reject any entry that is inappropriate.

They don't want weapons on the scarecrows, but this is in tension with some of their design suggestions: e.g. policemen or soldiers.

There was was no restriction on who helps build the scarecrow. Ours was very much a group effort. Shelly suggested that we build a Jimmy Buffett scarecrow. Judy Heflin, a workmate of Shelly's, did the face on the head. I donated two shirts and a pair of pants and found a felt parrot in an Ohio antique store. A friend donated the ukelele. Shelly put it all together.

We didn't win...seemed not even to place. But it was fun.

This is Jen Rhiannon, who passes out the applications, and takes in the completed scarecrows. 65 applications were passed out and 61 scarecrows were submitted. No disqualifications.

There going to be several views of most of them.




















